Rev. Clarence Deloch, Sr. was born on November 8, 1946 to Ursulea and Matthews Deloch, Sr. in Saint Louis, Missouri. Both parents as well as three brothers, Edward Sr., Arthur and Frederick; and one sister, Rosemary, all preceded him in death.

Clarence graduated from Soldan High School then entered the U.S. Army, where he served a tour in Vietnam during the war. During the mid 1960's, Clarence was one of the premier pitchers in the Tandy League, which led to his hall of fame induction.

Clarence married Gwen, his high school love, shortly after high school. They were married for forty-eight years. Gwen preceded him in death in 2017. Clarence suddenly departed this life on March 7, 2024. Gwen's eternal light is on, so Clarence can find his way back to her.
