You were also our friend.

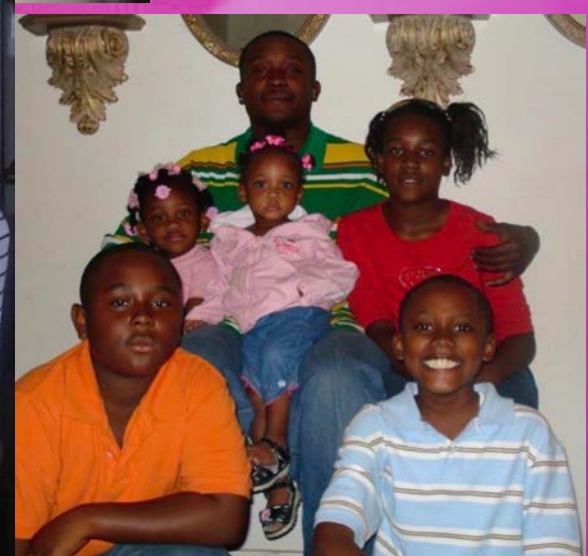

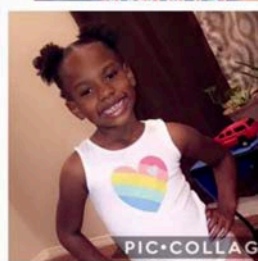
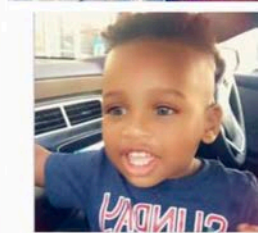
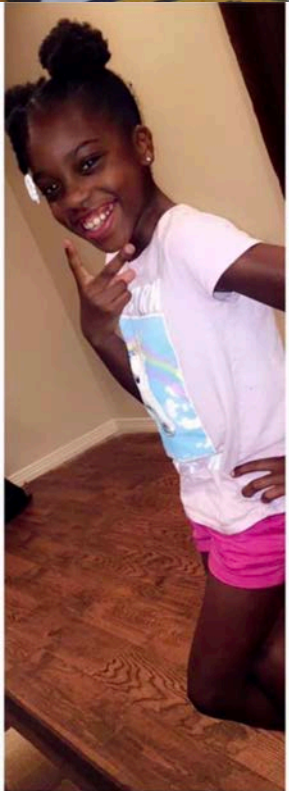


Weep Not For Me
