Her Life & Legacy

When her father remarried, Crezzetta became the oldest of what would eventually become 14 children.

She grew up in the New Hope Community where she attended school. She was active in sports and excelled in the game of Basketball. She loved school. She actively served in the church as a child and continued through adulthood until her health failed.

Having lived 98 years Crezzetta lived a full and productive life. She enjoyed cooking, gardening, and pressing hair. It was her pleasure to serve others. She worked as a housekeeper for several families in Kilgore. Over the years she kept the homes and helped raise the children of Charles and Joanne Whiteside, Beau and Joyce Davidson, Lewis and Imogene Terry, and Larry and Judy Perkins. She also provided food and shelter to many siblings, nephews, nieces as well as children in the community. She could always, "Make room for one more."
